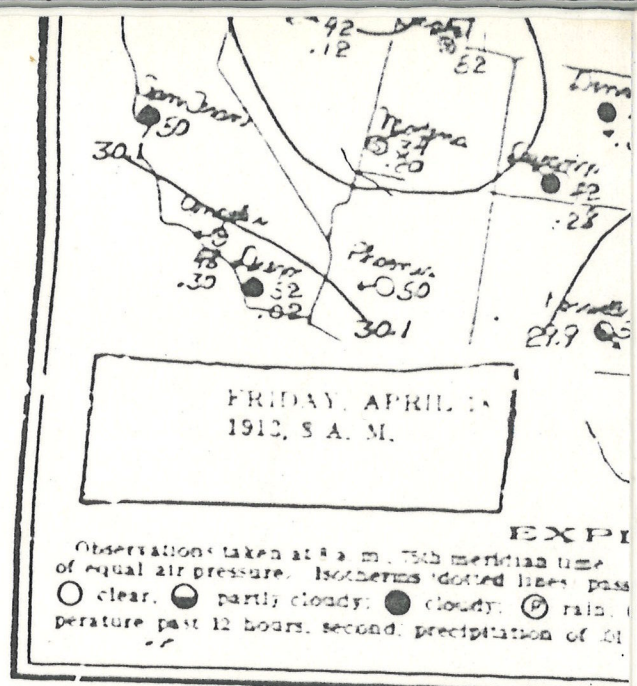
THIRD DEATH IN FAMILY WITHIN A SHORT TIME

William Connyingham passed away
at St. Vincent's Hospital shortly be-
fore one o'clock this morning, his wife
and other members of the family be-
ing at his bedside when the final sum-
mons came. Deceased was ill six
weeks and after two weeks' serious
illness at home, the attending physi-
cian advised his removal to the hos-
pital. His death is peculiarly sad
in the fact this is the third death in
