Dear Mr. Conyngham,

My name is Yeoman First Class (YN1) Jerome J. Dennis, U.S. Navy. I began a project recently that you may very well be interested in. As the Ship's Historian for USS CONYNGHAM (DDG-17), I am trying to trace the Family Tree of the ship's namesake, Captain Gustavus Conyngham.

Captain Conyngham was born in County Donegal, Ireland in 1744 (the exact date is unknown). He emigrated to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in 1763. He married Anne Hockley in 1773. Captain Conyngham was the Commander of the Colonial Cutter REVENGE. As a ship's captain he was more bold and daring than John Paul Jones. However, since he wasn't interested in fame and glory his feats were, for the most part, unknown. He died November 27, 1819 and is buried in St. Peter's Episcopal Churchyard in Philadelphia.

My research has taken me through the Navy Archives Office in Washington, D.C. and through the Edward J. Conyngham family of Portland, Oregon. My mother has searched through the telephone book section of the Township Library in Middletown, New Jersey and I've done the same here in Bath, Maine. This telephone book searching has led me to find 15 Conyngham families. It was through this search that I obtained your name and address.

The reason for this letter is to ask your help in completing my project. Specifically, I would like to you send me any information you may have that pertains to your family lineage, as far back as practical. Please don't go to any unnecessary expense for this unless you desire to do so. Anything you provide would be most helpful. I am enclosing a return envelope for your convenience. In return for your efforts, I will send you a complete copy of my work, whether or not your family is related to Captain Conyngham.

eighteenth century. Another famous Gaelic poet of that era was Michael Comyn (1688-1760), of Kilcorcoran, Co. Clare. His son Michael Comyn (b. 1704), emigrated to France where he was accepted as one of the nobility of France* and his grandson, John Francis Comyn (1742-1793), was guillotined as an aristocrat during the French Revolution, while David Comyn (1853-1907), another Clareman, was particularly active in the movements which led up to the formation of the Gaelic League. Some families of Comyn came to north Clare as papists transplanted under the Cromwellian régime from east of the Shannon, but the Inquisitions of earlier in the seventeenth century prove that families of the name were already well established in the county before that period. William Cumming (1769-1852), famous as a portrait-painter, was an Irishman who lived and worked in Ireland.

O'CUNIGAN, MacCunigan, Cunningham, (Dongan, Counihan).

The surname Cunningham or Conyngham is among the 75 most numerous in Ireland, the estimated number of persons so called in 1954 being 8,550. They are distributed over all four provinces, the majority being found in the Ulster counties of Down and Antrim and in the Connacht counties of Galway and Roscommon. In the former the families in question are for the most part of Scottish origin; in the latter they are native Irish. The original Irish-Gaelic forms Ó Connagáin and Mac Cuinneagáin were first written in English as O'Cunnigan and MacCunnigan. Under the anglicizing influence of three centuries of British occupation many old Gaelic families, having dropped the O or Mac, gradually assumed an English or Scottish name approximating to theirs in sound. Thus Cunnigan became Cunningham.

There is hardly another name in Ireland which appears in the Registrar-General's records, voters' lists and so forth in so many different guises. Side by side with the standard form Cunningham, we find Coonaghan, Counihan, Cunnighan, Kinningham, Kinighan, Kinagam, Kinnegan and MacCunnigan in Ulster, while Conaghan and Kinaghan are two of the many variants elsewhere. Counihan and Coonaghan, however, are properly the anglicized forms of the north Munster name Ó Cuanacháin.

The true Irish Cunninghams trace their descent from two sources in Connacht, the Gaelic forms given above denoting son (mac) or descendant (ó) of Connagan, which is a diminutive of the personal name Conn. One branch stems from Fiachra, brother of the famous Niall of the Nine Hostages and father of the last pagan King of Ireland, and was located in Co. Sligo; the other is a sept of the Ui Máine (often called Hy Many), a widespread group of septs centred in Counties Galway and Roscommon of which O'Kelly was the most important.

*Descendants of Wild Geese of the name were also enrolled among the nobility of Spain.

As is not unusual in the case of smaller families which, notwithstanding the destruction of the Gaelic order after 1603, refused to accept English rule, no arms are on record at the Office of Arms in Dublin Castle for O'Cunnigan or MacCunnigan. The well-known Cunningham arms are those of a Scottish family, several branches of which settled in Ireland in the seventeenth century and became influential in the north. There is a tradition that these Cunninghams were originally Irish settlers in Scotland: be that as it may they were in Scotland as early as the eleventh century, since their arms and their motto "over fork over" are based on an incident which occurred about the year 1050 when the Cunninghams' ancestor saved the life of Malcolm Canmore, afterwards King of Scotland, by covering him with hay and thus concealing him from MacBeth's pursuing forces.

The most distinguished Irishman of the name was probably **Timothy Cunningham** (d. 1761), the antiquarian, member and benefactor of the Royal Irish Academy. Mention may also be made of Henry first Marquess Conyngham (1766-1832), who was an Irish representative peer and a man of influence in England in the reign of George IV, and also of John Cunningham (1729-1773), the Irish actor and poet.

Some of the Cunninghams in Ulster acquired their surname in quite a different way from those dealt with above. There was a minor sept of MacDonnegan in Co. Down, one of whom, John Dongan or MacDonnegan, was Bishop of Down from 1395 to 1412, while earlier in the fourteenth century Florence MacDonnagan was Bishop of Dromore. In this area the name was first corrupted to MacConegan and later some of these MacConegans changed this to Cunningham in imitation of the Scottish settlers. Others, however, retained the more correct modernized form Dunnigan, and Dunnigans are still to be found in Co. Down. This name is not to be confused with Donegan or Dongan—Ó Donnagáin in Irish—an important sept of Muskerry, Co. Cork, whose territory was around Rathluirc. Thomas Donegan (1634-1715), last Earl of Limerick (of the first creation), Governor of New York from 1683 to 1691, was the most distinguished man of this name.

MACCUNNEEN, O'Cunneen, Kenyon, (Kinnane).

The fact that Cunneen is never found nowadays with a prefix hides the fact that it represents actually two quite distinct surnames. MacCoinín is that of a literary family of Erris, Co. Mayo. It is anglicized Kenning and Kenyon, as well as Cunneen, and also by pseudo-translation as Rabbitt. Cunneen, and Rabbitt too, are the forms used in English for the Offaly family of Ó Coinín. A variant of this is Ó Cuinín which in turn is used as a variant of Ó Cuineáin, quite a different name in Irish: this is now indistinguishable from Ó Cuinneáin, a surname well-known in north Tipperary

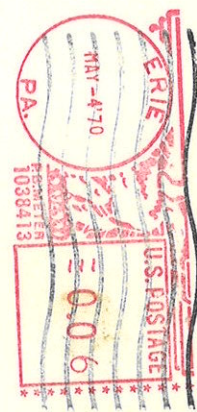
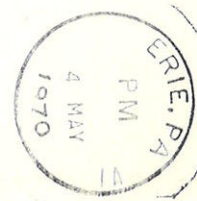

What's In Your Name?

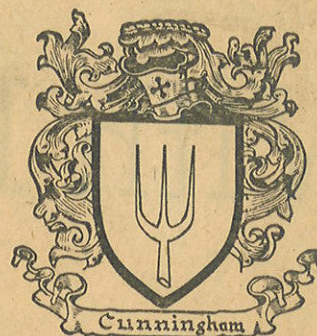
There is hardly another name in Ireland or Scotland that has so many variations in spelling than Cunningham. To mention a few; in Ireland it is spelled variously: Cunigan, Counihan, Coonaghan, Kinningham and Kinnegan. In Scotland: Cuninghame, Cunningham, Cunnyngame and Cunynham.

The original Irish-Gaelic forms of O Connagain and MacCuinneagain were first anglicised 'O Cunnigan' and 'MacCunnigan' but the influence of three centuries of British occupation caused Cunnigan to become Cunningham. In Scotland the Cunningham name is of territorial origin from the Northern district of the name in Ayrshire.

The name appears in early Scottish history when a Harvey de Cunningham fought at the Battle of Largs in 1263 and in the year 1321 King Robert Bruce gave the lands of Lamburton to Hugh de Cunningham.

Many of the Scottish Cunninghams appear to have been Rectors of churches and as early as 1403 William de Cunningham, Vicar of Dundonald was threatened with excommunication if he did not stop intruding into the administration of the poort house of Polmadie.

The majority of Irish Cunninghams are to be found in the Counties of Down and Antrim in the Northern part of Ireland, but these are for the most part of Scottish origin. The Cunninghams of Counties Galway and Roscommon are native Irish who trace their descent from two sources, one



from Fiachra, brother of Niall of the Nine Hostages and father of the last pagan king of Ireland, the other is asept of Ui Maine.

A Scottish Cunningham called Andrew who was a glazier (man involved with fitting glass into windows) by trade arrived in Boston at the early date of 1680. He was a member of the Scottish Charitable Society and in 1685 he married Sarah Gibson in Boston.

The importance of the Cunningham name in Scotland may be appreciated by the fact that the First Earl of Glencairn, whose name was Cunningham, was created in 1488 and this Earldom continued to exist up to the year 1796 becoming extinct on the death of the 15th Earl.

Many grants of arms have been made to the Cunningham name and the one illustrated is of ancient origin. It shows a black shakefork on a silver background.

There has not been any connection made between Captain Gustavus Conyngham and John J. Conyngham.

Captain Gustavus Conyngham was born in County Donegal, Ireland in 1744 (exact date not known) He. imagrated to Philadelphia, Pa. in 1763. He married Anne Hockley in 1773.

He sailed to France on the supply ship "Charming Betty" in the spring of 1777. He was given a naval commission and the 10 gun raider "Surprise".

He raided British ships in the English Channel and raided the Isle of Guernsy and carried off the Lieutenant and the Garrison Adjutant. He sailed to Dunkirk with his prizes.

Imprisoned by France at the demand of the British Crown, he was allowed to escape; equipped by friends with the speedy 14 gun cutter "Revenge".

With this ship he seized 60 British vessels. Early in 1779 on his way back to America, He was caught by the British Frigate H.M. Galatea in April 1779. He was shipped , in chains, to England. There with 50 companions he tunneled out of Old Mill Prison.

How he got back to America is not known. He died November 27, 1819 and is buried in St. Peters Episcopal Churchyard in Philadelphia.

This information is from the Ship's Historian USS CONYNGHAM (DDG-17) and a "Picture History of the U.S. Navy".

Dear Mr. Conyngham:

You indicated in an ad in the March-April issue of The Genealogical Helper that you were interested in hearing from anyone with this name or anyone who was researching it.

My mother's maiden name was Cunningham which is not quite the same, but one of her brothers settled in Toronto, Canada, where he was frequently called Conyngham, and generally considered Scottish. I don't know whether that counts or not, but I am researching the name, Cunningham.

The first of that name in our family who came to this country in 1802 was Alexander Cunningham. The original family lived in Scotland and then moved to County Donegal in North Ireland. Alexander's father was John Cunningham who was born and reared in County Donegal. Alexander was quite young when he came to America and apparently landed in Philadelphia where he worked to pay for his passage. He then walked to Pittsburgh and on to Steubenville, Ohio. His parents and family arrived in 1805, and lived near the village of Cross Creek a few miles west of Steubenville. They went to the St. James Episcopal Church which was founded in 1800, the oldest organized parish in the State of Ohio.

On March 11, 1819, Alexander married Mary Thompson who was born and raised in the County Antrim near Donegal and who, with her parents, brothers and sisters, came to America in 1810 and settled in Jefferson County, Ohio. They had seven children, the oldest of whom was John, born February 2, 1820. He was my great-grandfather. He married Sarah Ann Bone of adjoining Harrison County (Ohio) on June 27, 1847. Sarah Ann had been born and raised on the Isle of Wight. She was born December 11, 1824 and her parents were Thomas and Mary Ann Hillyer Bone. Her father having died, she came to this country in 1836 when she was twelve years old, with her mother, her sister Amelia aged nine and brother Thomas aged two, to Harrison County to join the Robert Pittis family who had come to American in 1831. Robert Pittis was either her uncle or her mother's uncle.

John and Sarah moved to College Township in Knox County on

September 1, 1852, when my grandfather, Robert Pittis Cunningham, was about four months old. They settled on a farm east of the town of Gambier, Ohio (where Kenyon College is located).

I have a copy of an article which appeared in a Scottish Newspaper about 1930, entitled "Glencairn Title" which I will enclose.

I have no idea if any of this is of interest to you, but I couldn't resist writing. I am wondering if you have done any research in Scotland or Ireland on your lines. I have some books suggesting ways to go about it, but as yet have not done anything with it.

GLENCAIRN TITLE

Earl of Glencairn was a Scottish title borne by the family of Cunningham from 1488-1796. The first earl was Alexander Cunningham, a lord of Parliament, who was killed when fighting for James III, in 1488.

His descendant, William, the 4th earl, took part in the affairs of both England and Scotland in the reign of Henry VIII., and his son Alexander, the 5th earl (died 1574), was concerned in the troubles of Scotland under Mary Stuart--at time he was with the reformers and at others with the Queen.

William, the 9th earl (died 1664), was perhaps the most prominent of them all, for he was responsible for the rising in Scotland in favour of Charles II. He led this rising in 1653, but it soon collapsed, and he was imprisoned. Later he became Lord Chancellor of Scotland.

The 14th earl, James, who died childless in 1791, is known as the friend of Burns, who wrote a lament on his death (the one beginning "The wind blew hollow frae the hills.") His brother, the 15th earl, died childless in 1796, and the title became extinct.

The Castle of Caprington, Kilmarnock, in Riccarton parish, is the property of Major W. Wallace Cuninghame, who recently succeeded his father, the late Lieutenant-Colonel John A. S. Cuninghame of Caprington, Ayrshire, and Auchlochan, Lanarkshire. The late Colonel completed the building as it now is, but its design dates from 1797, in the time of Sir William Cuninghame, 4th Baronet of Lambrughton.--N. B.

Thank you for marking the Neff house. I noticed it was close to the Gitting house, also in the family. I will make copies for our family members and they are sure to be just as delighted as I am.

In reading through some of Dean's family history from Maryland I have encountered information on those members who immigrated from Scotland. Some were from the MacGregor clan. This clan also included people named Conyngham; the same last name as yours. I was surprised to see the same spelling. From what I have read it appears the MacGregor clan was unpopular with the ruling party in Scotland a few hundred years ago. As a result, those in power abolished the MacGregor name. This forced the clan members to take on different surnames which in many cases were maternal surnames. Later rulers in Scotland restored the MacGregor family name. Some went back to it and others kept the maternal surnames.

Reading Scottish history has been driving my brain crazy; too many battles within the country and with England. That must mean it is time to start on German history to learn what was happening when the Neff's and Gittings and Orth's and Kulh's lived in Germany.

Thanks again for thinking of me and sending the map.



I must point out the fact that the I.G.P. has experienced serious delays in its referral service, due mainly to a protracted postal dispute in the Central Sorting Office, Dublin April - June, which caused much delay and upset to the smooth operation of their service.

In brief, I would advise a search of 3 hours initially, to check property records of East Cork and then relevant parish records for reference to John Jos. CONYNGHAM...1848.
