



Dear WHITE-TAHNEY-SULLIVAN family member:

I am attempting to research and trace my family history and genealogy. I would appreciate any and all the help you can give me in this matter. What follows might help you also.

George J. White, a plumber by trade, married one Delia E. Tahney Sullivan on June 15, 1902 at St. Viator's Catholic Church on Addison Ave. in Chicago. Mr. James Collins and Cecilia M. Brown were the witnesses. George was 29 years of age at the time (having been born in 1872 in Illinois). Delia said she was 30 but records seem to indicate she was actually 32 (having been born December 1869 in Ireland?) George's parents, John and Catharina? Catherine? or Catrina, were said to have been born in Illinois.

This was Delia's second marriage. She had earlier married a Timothy E. Sullivan, a Chicago policeman, who died of natural causes in 1899. At the time of his death, Delia and Timothy lived at 82 Gresham Ave. (renumbered 3015 Gresham) and they had two sons: John Sullivan born October 4, 1895 and Joseph James born December 15, 1896.* Before living on Gresham Ave., the Sullivan family had resided at 752 and 658 (old numbering system) Carroll Ave, Chicago.

In the 1930's the two Sullivan boys would get themselves involved with the slot machine racket in the River Grove area and would become associated with the Copolla⁺ brothers in this business. In July 14, 1935 Joseph J. was killed in a rather questionable auto accident at 615 S. Cicero and Harrison Street. At the time of his death he lived with his paternal? aunt, Alice Kett at 3313 W. Madison Street. Joseph used the alias of Joseph Driscoll and had lived with a friend, Joseph Dalton, at 2236 Campbell. He had not married and he left no children. He had also worked as a switchman with the Northwestern Railroad. He was buried in Calvary from Most Precious Blood Church.

John Sullivan, alias John McKune, spent most of his life in prison.

Starting in 1913 and continuing to 1936, John Sullivan was in and out of houses of correction. In 1936, when John got out of prison (Joliet State Penitentiary), he returned to Chicago with the intention of assuming control of his dead brother's share of the slot machine business. He married for the second time on December 17, 1936. After divorcing his first wife (Mildred _____) earlier in 1936, he married Rae Walker, and they moved into a home at 4809 Washington Blvd. It was across the street from this residence that he was gunned down by unknown assailants on August 30, 1937. His occupation was listed as a "chlorine salesman - self employed." He also is buried in Calvary Cemetery. As far as I know now, he left no children.

* His death certificate incorrectly lists his date of birth as Oct. 21, 1897.

Now back to the White family. George and Delia White had four children. William Francis (my father) born June 24, 1903/Died. November 6, 1981. Cecilia Evelina White born December 14, 1904. She died of TB in March 31, 1931; Margaret Patricia who was born on December 5, 1906 and died the next day; and Alice Norine who would die as an adopted child of Patrick Meagher in Libertyville, IL. Baptismal sponsors of the White children included: Thomas Gafka, Mary Gaffey, Edward Roland, Cecilia Roland, and Margaret Roland. The White family lived at 82 Gresham (now 3015 Gresham) until about 1908. That is when the mystery begins.

On February 4, 1907 Delia filed for a divorce from George. On February 15, 1907 she was granted the divorce and the custody of the children -- "William Francis and Cecelie Evelyn" (sic?) Note Alice Norine had not been born yet. Since Alice's baptismal record lists her father as George White, one might conclude that evidently George and Delia had reconciled. Also, on October 28, 1922, Delia's death certificate will indicate that she was still a married woman and not a divorced or widowed person as the certificate makes provision for. The 1910 US Census lists Geo. & Delia living with "son" Joseph Sullivan at 527 N. Centre St. Chicago. On December 1 or 2 of 1908 William, Cecilia and Alice were admitted to the St. Vincent de Paul Orphanage, 721 North LaSalle Street. Evidently, since the two Sullivan boys were in their teens, they were sent to an orphanage in Chicago designed for older children or were "adopted" by a relative -- eg. Alice Kett?

What happened to this family to cause this split? What happened to George White the plumber? What happened to Delia? Did George and Delia reconcile again, later on, and consummate more children? If you know anything about any of this or any of these people, please write and fill me in. It does not have to be a type written note or a formal reply. But please reply!

They were married again, by J.P.A., on Sept 2, 1908 in Chicago.
A George White of 6641 Green St., Chicago (son of John & Catherine White) entered the U.S. Service (Army?) May 3, 1918. He left the service June 9, 1919. Is this my grandfather White??? *No*

I do know that between 1909 & 1911, the White children of George and Delia White were adopted by families living in Iowa and Illinois. To my knowledge, Alice and Cecilia died without marrying and without children.
* The names, addresses, dates, etc. are known to me.

Delia E. Tahney Sullivan White died of "organic heart disease" on October 28, 1922. Besides listing her as "married," the death certificate indicated that she was 48 years old at the time of death, her father's name as James Tahney, and that she resided at 1415 Austin Ave. at the time of death. She is buried with Timothy E. Sullivan, Joseph and John Sullivan and Margaret P. White in the Sullivan plot in Calvary Cemetery.

I do not propose to be another Alex Hailey, nor do I have the slightest inclination of this study becoming another Roots. However, I have put a great deal of time and some money into this project since I began researching in 1980, and I would really appreciate it if you would take the time and make the effort to inform me of the slightest bit of information you may have about any of the family members mentioned above. A SASE has been provided for your reply.



Montana law considers birth and/or death certificates to be personal property. They can be released only to the person listed on the certificate or if they can show legal need for the certificate. If they are to go to someone other than the individual, the individual must sign a release form to accompany the request. In the instance of a minor child the certificate is issued to the parent or parents listed on the certificate.

We do not have any provisions for supplying free certified copies of certificates to Veterans.

INSTRUCTIONS AND FEES FOR VITAL STATISTICS RECORDS SERVICE

(Effective January 30, 1992)

The Vital Records and Statistics Bureau maintains permanent storage of original certificates of birth, deaths dating back to 1907. The bureau also maintains indexes of marriage and divorce records for Montana dating back to 1945. The bureau is authorized to perform legal amendments to filed certificates and to create substitute birth certificates and to file delayed certificates of birth. The bureau issues certified copies of certificates through an application process and provides record location services for marriage and divorce records.

CERTIFIED COPIES OF BIRTH/DEATH CERTIFICATES Fee: \$10.00

1. Requestor should complete an application form and submit it to the bureau along with the appropriate fee. Checks should be made payable to the **MONTANA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH. CANADIAN** requests must be made by Money Order with U. S. Funds.
2. Applications are subject to approval/disapproval under provisions of Montana laws and Department of Health regulations.

SEARCHES OF MARRIAGE AND DIVORCE INDEXES Fee \$10.00 PER HOUR

1. Names and appropriate dates should be submitted to the bureau, in writing, along with the appropriate fees. Checks should be made payable to **MONTANA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH**. Searches consist of 5 years searched for each \$10.00.
2. There are some searches the bureau is not able to conduct. In these cases, the fees will be refunded.
3. If the requested record is located, the requestor will be provided the name of the county in which the record is on file. If a certified copy of the record is needed the Clerk of the District Court in the County of occurrence needs to be contacted.
4. Response time by the bureau to these requests may be as long as **60 working days**.

GENEALOGICAL USE OF VITAL RECORDS is available under limited conditions. Certified copies of death certificates may be requested provided the death occurred at least (20) years prior the date of application. Certified copies of birth certificates may be requested provided the requestor submits proof of death and provided that the death occurred at least thirty (30) years prior to the date of the request.

1. Requestor should submit a completed application to the Bureau along with the appropriate fees (non-refundable). Checks should be made payable to the **MONTANA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH**.
2. **RESPONSE TIME BY THE BUREAU TO THESE REQUESTS MAYBE AS LONG AS 60 WORKING DAYS.**
